Budget Lacks New Infrastructure Projects

British Columbia's latest budget has left construction industry stakeholders wanting, with a focus on individual benefits ahead of the October election but scant details on infrastructure investments or support for the construction sector. Critics argue the budget's lack of new infrastructure projects and the continuation of community benefit agreements restrict competitive bidding and do not adequately support the construction workforce or address the province's housing and infrastructure needs.
