Federal Budget 2024 Targets Fiscal Stability and Growth Amid New Expenditures

To address the over \$38 billion in new spending announced, the federal government is expected to introduce tax increases in the 2024 budget, as outlined by Finance Minister Chrystia Freeland. This approach aims to balance the budget's direct impact of approximately \$21 billion from these expenditures while maintaining the current year's deficit level, necessitating fiscal adjustments in a context of slow economic growth and efforts to avoid a recession.

Following the federal budget's minimal transit funding, the B.C. government has allocated \$300 million to enhance transit services in the Lower Mainland. This investment aims to purchase additional buses and increase service on 60 routes, starting significant improvements in September.

WorkSafeBC's 2023 update introduces new or revised Threshold Limit Values (TLVs) for various substances, designated as British Columbia Exposure Limits (ELs), to regulate workers' exposure to chemical substances. This ensures safe airborne concentration levels across workplaces, with ELs set for different exposure durations. The process includes reviewing health data, consulting stakeholders, and awaiting the Board of Directors' decision on adoption.

The Surrey-Langley SkyTrain Extension Set to Transform Transit in Metro Vancouver by 2028

The Government of British Columbia has chosen South Fraser Station Partners to design and build eight stations for the Surrey-Langley SkyTrain



extension, which will stretch 16 kilometres from King George Station to downtown Langley, at a cost of \$4.01 billion. This extension marks the first major rapid transit project south of the Fraser in 30 years.
